
# **Crying Cooing Communication:** Baby's First Year



## Communication is made up of two parts: receptive skills and expressive skills



Receptive skills are what babies take in – hearing and understanding



Expressive skills are what babies put out – sounds, gestures, and speech

## Talking, playing, and reading to your baby helps build communication skills. Be sure to:

- Describe to your baby what you are doing
- Talk in a slow, sing-song voice
- Point out objects while you talk

- Respond to and imitate your baby's sounds
- Describe pictures while you read together
- Uses body language and gestures

## **Important Communication Milestones**

#### 3 Months

- Makes eye contact
- Turns head towards sound or voice
- Quiets or smiles in response to your voice
- Cries differently for different needs (e.g. "da, da, da")
- Shows interest in faces

### 6 Months

- Babbles like "bababa" and "wawawa"
- Uses babbling to get attention
- Enjoys games like peek-a-boo
- Fears loud and unexpected noises

### 9 Months

- Adds new sounds when babbling
- Looks at people and familiar objects when named
- Uses body language and gestures

### 12 Months

- Uses "mama" or "dada" to call mom or dad
- Makes sounds back and forth with others
- Responds to simple directions
- Pays attention to where you are looking and pointing
- Says their first one or two words

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
